Dear Parents/Guardians of Fifth Grade Students:

Greetings and please allow me to be the first to officially welcome you to Mayfield Woods! We know what an exciting time this can be for students and parents, and we look forward to working together to help you and your child transition to middle school. Before you read the rest of this letter, be sure to mark your calendar for January 15, 2019* at 5:45 p.m. for our "Rising 6th Grade Parent Orientation" (see the attached flyer for more information).

As you begin to think about middle school, we encourage you and your child to discuss her/his strengths and interests. Very soon you will have to start making some choices that will aid our school in making staffing and scheduling decisions regarding your child's 6th grade classes, and we will review these choices at orientation on January 15. At this time, however, I ask that you read the following information carefully, as it is time for you to discuss and decide whether or not your child will participate in music performance courses next year. Please be sure to complete the attached form and return it to your child's 5th grade teacher no later than January 18, 2019.

Music Performance Groups: Mayfield Woods students may choose to participate in one of three music performance groups: band, orchestra <u>or</u> chorus. Depending on staffing, scheduling and interest, there *may be an option in 6th grade for students who are in band or orchestra to also participate in chorus*. Please consider whether or not you would like your child to participate in:

- Band	- Chorus	- Orchestra & chorus
- Orchestra	- Band & chorus	- No music performance courses

Like elementary school, regular **music sectionals** (in band and orchestra only) and **afterschool performances** will be a part of your child's commitment to the music performance program and are course requirements. Sectionals are small group rehearsals that provide opportunities for the music teacher to assess students' progress and teach specific content/techniques. Sectionals are typically scheduled for 50 minutes once per week as **pull-outs** from other classes (including math, science, English, social studies and related arts) on a rotating basis so that students will not miss the same class more than twice per quarter. Sectionals are a required part of the program and may only be missed in order to take an HCPSS mandated assessment.

Registration: As we begin to plan and schedule your children for courses next year, we ask that **all parents/guardians complete the attached music performance enrollment form**. If your child is not interested in participating, you may also "opt out" of these courses on the attached form. As you consider these music performance courses, be sure to do so in the context of the workload of all of your child's courses for the upcoming school year. Schedule changes are not always possible after the school year begins, and even when they are, such changes can have a significant impact on a middle school student. *Please note: students who are scheduled for a reading and/or mathematics seminar may have fewer options regarding participation*.

Middle School Schedule in Detail

- The middle school schedule is seven periods. All students receive daily instruction aligned to Maryland's College and Career-Ready Standards in English Language Arts, Mathematics, Science, and Social Studies.
- Maryland regulations require:
 - All students to take Health Education (a quarter long course, which is scheduled every other day for a semester), Physical Education (typically scheduled every other day for the entire year), and a Fine Arts (Art and/or Music) course every year.
 - All students to take Family and Consumer Science in either 7th or 8th grade to complete the financial literacy requirement.
 - All students to complete at least one Innovation and Inquiry Reading Module related to career readiness or receive this information through another course.
- Students who are reading on or below grade level will take at least one quarter of reading in 6th grade, unless the students are enrolled in a reading seminar. There is no reading requirement for 7th or 8th grade.
