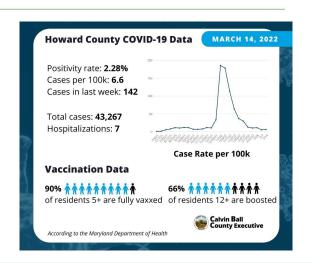




## **COVID-19 VACCINATION IN HOWARD COUNTY (HC)**

#### **LOCAL COVID-19 IMPACT**

- As of March 14, 2022, in Howard County, 349 members of our community have died.
- 90% of residents 5+ are fully vaccinated
- 66% or residents 12+ are boosted

### **COVID-19 VACCINATION BY AGE IN HC AS OF MARCH 2, 2022**

| AGE GROUP        | % w/At Least One<br>Dose | % Fully Vaccinated | % Eligible<br>w/Booster |
|------------------|--------------------------|--------------------|-------------------------|
| 5-11             | 69.3%                    | 61.9%              | 51.1%                   |
| 12-17            | 95%                      | 91.7%              | 66.4%                   |
| 12+              | 95%                      | 93.4%              | 58.1%                   |
| Total Population | 94.5%                    | 84.9%              |                         |











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## **COVID-19 SYMPTOMS**

## Similar symptoms to previous variants:

- Runny Nose/Sneezing
- Headache
- Fatigue
- Sore Throat
- Body Aches

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### **CORONAVIRUS MUTATION**

- · Variants are expected
- It is the nature of RNA viruses to evolve/change gradually
- For example, flu viruses change often, which is why doctors recommend that you get a new flu vaccine every year.



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# 5 THINGS TO KNOW ABOUT THE COVID-19 VACCINE FOR CHILDREN AGES 5 THROUGH 11 YEARS



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#### SAFE AND EFFECTIVE

- 69.4% of ≥ 5 years of age are fully vaccinated in the United States as of March 14, 2022
- mRNA technology is not new
- Vaccines authorized or approved by the Food and Drug Administration (FDA) have been thoroughly tested and found to be safe and effective in preventing severe COVID-19.
- COVID-19 vaccine safety monitoring has been the most intense and comprehensive in United States history and is ongoing.





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#### CAN HELP SLOW THE SPREAD TO OTHERS

## Vaccinating children ages 5 years and older can:

- Protect the entire family including:
  - Siblings who are not yet eligible for vaccination
  - Family members who may be at increased risk
- Help them safely participate in sports, playdates, and other group activities.
- Protect those who medically cannot receive the vaccine



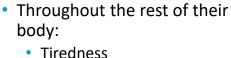






#### HAS COMMON SIDE EFFECTS

- On the arm where your shot got the shot.
  - Pain
  - Redness
  - Swelling



- Headache
- Muscle pain
- Chills
- Fever
- Nausea













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#### DOSAGE IS SPECIFIC FOR AGE GROUPS

- The vaccine given to adults and teens cannot be given to children ages 5 through 11; however, they have the same active ingredients.
- COVID-19 vaccine dosage varies by patient age on the day of vaccination, not by weight.
- Children will need a second shot of the Pfizer-BioNTech COVID-19 vaccine three weeks after their first shot.
- The COVID-19 vaccine can be given on the same day and time as other vaccines.









#### **HELP REDUCE SERIOUS ILLNESS**

- Vaccination can help keep children from getting seriously sick even if they do get COVID-19.
- Children who have already had COVID-19 should still get the vaccine.
- Multisystem Inflammatory Syndrome in Children (MIS-C):
  - A rare, but serious complication associated with COVID-19 in which different body parts can become inflamed.
  - Despite breakthrough cases and setbacks with Omicron, evidence continues to support the vaccination of ALL eligible children

## **MAKING CHOICES (1 OF 3)**

#### Layered prevention strategies can slow the spread of COVID-19:

- Get Vaccinated and Stay Up-to-Date with Your Vaccines
  - Fully Vaccinated: A person has received the primary series of vaccine
  - Up-to-Date: A person has received the primary series of vaccine plus any boosters
- Wear a Mask
  - If you are sick or at the recommendation of your healthcare provider;
  - If you are around those whose vaccine status you don't know;
  - If it's required;
  - If you want to wear one.



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## **MAKING CHOICES (2 OF 3)**

- Stay home if you are not feeling well.
- Test if you have been exposed or have symptoms
- Isolate if you test positive;
- Quarantine if you are identified as a close contact, following CDC guidelines.

Find a COVID-19 testing site available in your community OR use a home test kit if available.

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## **MAKING CHOICES (3 OF 3)**

Hearing from a community member, church member, neighbor, and friend remains one of the most effective methods to support others.

- Approach conversation with an open mind conflicting feelings are normal
- Listen for understanding
  - Be aware of your own feelings.
  - Focus on listening to the person rather than what you will say next or how you want to respond.
  - Meet others where they are respectfully and honestly.
